

**January 25th, 2017 Point-in-Time Census of Homeless Persons and Families-Sheltered
Chronic Homeless Analysis and Summary: 2017**

Definition: A person is chronically homeless if they have experienced 4 or more episodes of homelessness within the past three years where the combined length of time is AT LEAST 12 months or if they have been homeless for a year (12 months) or more continuously AND they have a “disabling condition”. HUD also requires counting the number of families and the number of people in families for the total chronically homeless population. **Sub-population data will not be included for family members (children) residing with adults.**

- 2013 - 37 (20 sheltered individuals, 11 sheltered in families, 6 unsheltered individuals)
- 2014 - 26 (26 sheltered individuals)
- 2015 - 41 (28 sheltered individuals, 4 sheltered in families, 9 unsheltered individuals)
- 2016 - 13 (11 sheltered individuals, 2 sheltered in families)
- 2017 - 8 (6 sheltered individuals, 2 unsheltered individuals)
